"it's an attitude God's people adopt, not because of happy circumstances but because of their hope in God's love and promise" (Mackie 2017)

Last Week

Philippians 3:1-11

- Paul's reason for confidence in the Christian life (v1-6)
- Not in his own background, training, status or ability; but in the relationship Paul has with Jesus. (v.7)
- What mattered most to Paul was to be found in Jesus, trusting in His death & resurrection and the promise of eternal life. (v.8)

I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead. (v.10-11)



- Paul is looking forward to the resurrection. (v.11)


