







What is the MOST IMPORTANT COMMANDMENT according to Jesus?









1. The MOST IMPORTANT command (v.28-34)

<u>Mark 12:28</u>

²⁸ One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him,

"Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"






THE FIRST IS, 'HEAR, O ISRAEL: THE LORD OUR GOD, THE LORD IS ONE; YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND, AND WITH ALL YOUR STRENGTH.'

THE SECOND IS THIS, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.'

> THERE IS <u>NO OTHER</u> COMMANDMENT GREATER THAN THESE.



1. The MOST IMPORTANT command (v.28-34)

It's two (2) commands in one:

- Love God with EVERYTHING you have (v.29-30) (cf. Deuteronomy 6:4-5; Shema = hear/listen)
- Love your neighbour as yourself (v.31) (cf. Leviticus 18:19)

³² "Well said, teacher," the man replied. "You are right in saying that God is one and there is no other but him. ³³ To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."



1. The MOST IMPORTANT command (v.28-34)

<u>1 Corinthians 13:1-3</u>

¹If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

1. The MOST IMPORTANT command (v.28-34)

Love for God and love for others is MORE IMPORTANT than sacrifice.

 ³³ To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

YOU ARE NOT FAR FROM THE KINGDOM OF GOD.

1. The MOST IMPORTANT command (v.28-34)

Q: What was the scribe missing? *What is needed for Him to enter the Kingdom?*

A: The Scribe needs Jesus!

The Scribe needs to attach himself to the King in order to enter into Jesus Kingdom.

The sad irony is the King was right in front of him and he missed it!

³⁵ While Jesus was teaching in the temple courts, he asked, **"Why do the teachers of the law say that the Messiah is the son of David?** ³⁶ David himself, speaking by the Holy Spirit, declared:

"The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand until I put your enemies under your feet."



This is clearly a Psalm about God speaking to King's David's lord... but who is this lord??



12:35-40

 Jesus is both HUMAN (a descendant of King David as prophesied) & DIVINE (the only Son of God).

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- By quoting Psalm 110 Jesus is shining a light on His identity as the promised Messiah – He is David's Lord.
- Psalm 110 doesn't just show Jesus identity it also confirms His authority!

3. The WARNING for His enemies (v.38-40)

<u>Mark 12:38-40</u>

³⁸ As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, ³⁹ and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets. ⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

3. The WARNING for His enemies (v.38-40)

- The warning here is for the Scribes (teachers of the Law) (v.38)
- Scribes were legal representatives
- If someone died, they would leave their estate in the hands of the scribes to divide it up according to their wishes (think: Executor of an Estate).
- Some complaints of these administrators taking liberties at the expense of estates

12:35-40 BEWARE OF THE SCRIBES

> THEY LIKE TO WALK AROUND IN LONG ROBES, AND TO BE GREETED WITH RESPECT IN THE MARKETPLACES, AND TO HAVE THE BEST SEATS IN THE SYNAGOGUES AND PLACES OF HONOR AT BANQUETS! THEY DEVOUR WIDOWS' HOUSES AND FOR THE SAKE OF APPEARANCE SAY LONG PRAYERS. THEY WILL RECEIVE THE GREATER CONDEMNATION.

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- The warning here is for the Scribes (teachers of the Law) (v.38)
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 - The person who loves God & the person who loves human praise can often look the same.

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
- The warning here is for the Scribes (teachers of the Law) (v.38)
- The warning is also for us (Beware the Scribes)
 - The person who loves God & the person who loves human praise can often look the same.
 - The person who loves their neighbour & the person who loves having the reputation for loving their neighbour can look the same.

4. The widow's CHALLENGING example (v.41-44)

Mark 12:38-40

⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. ⁴² But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.

⁴³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴ **They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on**."

4. The widow's CHALLENGING example (v.41-44)

- The widow's actions show us that she loved God completely (with all her heart, soul, mind & strength).
- She is commended by Jesus for her radical generosity despite her poverty. (v.43-44)
- The others gave out of their wealth (excess) she gave out of her poverty. (v.44)

So what?

The greatest command shows us our greatest failing... we have a SIN problem!

- We don't always love God with EVERYTHING we have.
- We struggle to love our neighbours as we love ourselves.

So what?

The greatest command shows us our greatest failing... we have a SIN problem!

The GOOD NEWS of the gospel is that Jesus fulfils this greatest commandment perfectly for us.

He loved God (the Father) completely and loved us so deeply that He willingly offered up His life for the forgiveness of our sins.

So what?

<u>1 John 4:10-12</u>

¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.
