

Mark 8:27-29

²⁷ Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?" ²⁸ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." ²⁹ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

One Solitary Life (James Allen Francis)

All the armies that ever marched All the navies that ever sailed All the parliaments that ever sat All the kings that ever reigned Put together have not affected The life of man on Earth As much as that One Solitary Life.

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Who do YOU say Jesus is?

Mark 8:28

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- Why is this an inadequate answer?

Jesus is MORE than one of the greatest people in the world. He is THE MESSIAH (Christ)!

Mark 8:29-30

²⁹ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" **Peter answered, "You are the Messiah."**³⁰ Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him.

YOU = Jesus. No one else.

ARE = Not might be, or could be, or maybe one day will be.

THE = Not one among many, but THE only one.

MESSIAH (Christ) = God's anointed King of the universe.

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Mark 1:1

The beginning of the good news about **Jesus the Messiah**, the Son of God


Psalm 2:7-8

- ⁷ I will proclaim the Lord's decree: "You are my son; today I have become your father.
- ⁸ Ask me, and I will make the nations your inheritance, the ends of the earth your possession.

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Every nation, tribe and tongue – we all belong to Jesus.



4. Our response?

Two options:

- 1. Accept the truth (as Peter did), and respond in worship & obedience
- 2. Ignore the evidence & reject Jesus claims, continue to live life our own way.

Ultimately, it's an all-or-nothing decision!

Mark 8:31-33

³¹ He then began to teach them that **the Son of Man** must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. 32 He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

Three Key Tasks of The Messiah

- 1. Rebuild & cleanse the Temple
- 2. <u>Defeat Israel's enemies</u>
- 3. Take up the throne.

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The Suffering Servant

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5. The journey of discipleship (following Jesus) leads to the cross. (v.31-33)

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Mark 8:34-38

³⁴ Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 35 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. ³⁶ What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? ³⁷ Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? 38 If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."








New operating system required!

- We need to give our lives COMPLETELY over to Jesus (daily).


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Mark 8:36-37

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




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- We need to lay down our lives as we pursue & work towards the establishment of God's eternal kingdom.
