(around 16 names assigned to Jesus)

Isaiah 9:6



"For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, **Everlasting Father**, Prince of Peace."



Luke 1:31-32 "you shall have a son... Son of the Most High..." (Virgin birth; incarnation [in the flesh]) Human & Divine; Man & God □ He is the "God-Man"



Mark 1:11 "You are my Son whom I love,

with you I am well pleased"

Mark 9:7 "This is my Son, whom I love.

Listen to Him."



"<u>Son of God</u>" = 40+ times "<u>Son of man</u>" = 85 times in Gospels

Son of God

✓ Fully God \checkmark Trinity (Tri-unity) = Father, Son & Holy Spirit ✓ Three persons; one substance ✓ Three heresies: ¹Modalism (3 modes of revelation); ²Subordinationism (Jesus & Holy Spirit re lesser beings); ³Tri-theism (three beings or gods)

Son of God

✓ <u>Omnipotent</u> – (all power) Heb 1:3 ✓ Omniscient – (all knowing) Jn 2:23-25, Jn 16:30 ✓ <u>Omnipresent</u> – (present everywhere) Matt 18:20; 28:20 \checkmark Eternal – (Jn 1:1) ✓ Immutable – (unchanging) Heb 13:8

<u>Son of Man</u> (fully human)

 \checkmark His birth ✓ "Word became flesh" (Jn 1:14) ✓ "He grew in wisdom etc" (Luke 2:40,52) Typical human attributes of a Jewish man

Why we need the Son

- 1. He shows us God (John 14:8-11)
- 2. He saves us from our sins (John 3:16)
- 3. To set us free from the fear of death (Hebs 2:14-15)

4. To sympathise with us in our weakness (Hebs 4:15)

5. To strengthen us in times of temptation (Hebs 4:15)
