<u>Mark 8:31</u>

"...the Son of Man **must suffer many things** and **be rejected** by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that **he must be killed** and after three days **rise again**."

<u>Mark 9:31-32</u>

³¹....."The Son of Man **is going to be delivered into the hands of men**. **They will kill him**, and after three days **he will rise**."

³² But **they did not understand** what he meant and where afraid to ask him about it.

<u>Mark 10:33-34</u>

³³ "We are going up to Jerusalem," he said, "and **the Son of Man will be delivered over** to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. **They will condemn him to death** and **will hand him over to the Gentiles**, ³⁴ **who will mock him and spit on him, flog him and kill him**. Three days later he will rise."

(Mark 10:35-41; cf. Mark 9:33-34)

Mark 9:33-34

³³ They came to Capernaum. When he was in the house, he asked them, **"What were you arguing about on the road?"** ³⁴ But they kept quiet because on the way **they had argued about who was the greatest.**

<u>Mark 10:35-37</u>

³⁵ ... "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."

³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.
³⁷ They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."

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- The Bible is clear God hates pride. (e.g. Proverbs 6:16-19; Prov. 8:13; Prov. 16:5)
- Self-seeking pride is sinful because it seeks to push God out of the spotlight and take all the glory for ourselves.

Pride takes innumerable forms but has only one end: self-glorification. That's the motive and ultimate purpose of pride—to rob God of legitimate glory and to pursue self-glorification, contending for supremacy with Him. The proud person seeks to glorify himself and not God, thereby attempting in effect to deprive God of something only He is worthy to receive. No wonder God opposes pride.

⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles **lord it over them**, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ **Not so with you**. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all.

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- This doesn't mean we should be pushovers or let people take advantage of us. (cf. Matthew 10:16; Colossians 4:5; 2 Timothy 1:7)
- Wherever God places us we must be distinct, humbly shaped by what Jesus has done for us.

<u>Mark 10:43-44</u>

⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to
 become great among you must be your servant,
 ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all.

<u>Mark 9:35</u>

⁴³ "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all."

<u>Mark 10:45</u>

⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man **did not come to be** served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

 The good news of the gospel is that Jesus came not to be served but to serve. To give His life as a ransom for many.

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- Jesus became our substitute and died in our place.
- He completely paid the price for our sins, once and for all!
