





## Proverbs 1:1-7

- 1 The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel:
- 2 for gaining wisdom and instruction; for understanding words of insight;
- 3 for receiving instruction in prudent behavior, doing what is right and just and fair;
- 4 for giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young—
- 5 let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance—
- 6 for understanding proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise.
- 7 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

# THE FEAR OF THE LORD

- "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction." (Prov 1:7)
- "Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD" (Prov 1:29)
- "...then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God." (Prov 2:5)
- "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding." (Prov 9:10)
- "The fear of the LORD adds length to life, but the years of the wicked are cut short." (Prov 10:27)
- "In the fear of the LORD one has strong confidence, and his children will have a refuge." (Prov 14:26)
- "The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, that one may turn away from the snares of death." (Prov 14:27)
- "Better a little with the fear of the LORD than great wealth with turmoil." (Prov 15:16)
- "The fear of the LORD is instruction in wisdom, and humility comes before honour." (Prov 15:33)
- "Through love and faithfulness sin is atoned for; through the fear of the LORD evil is avoided." (Prov 16:6)
- "The fear of the LORD leads to life; then one rests content, untouched by trouble." (Prov 19:23)
- "Humility is the fear of the LORD; its wages are riches and honour and life." (Prov 22:4)
- "Do not let your heart envy sinners, but always be zealous for the fear of the LORD." (Prov 23:17)

# THE FEAR OF THE LORD VARIATION

- "Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil." (Prov 3:7)
- "To fear the Lord is to hate evil; I hate pride and arrogance, evil behaviour and perverse speech." (Prov 8:13)
- "Whoever walks in uprightness fears the LORD, but he who is devious in his ways despises him." (Prov 14:2)
- "The wise fear the Lord and shun evil, but a fool is hotheaded and yet feels secure." (Prov 14:16)
- "My son, fear the LORD and the king, and do not join with those who do otherwise," (Prov 24:21)
- "Blessed is the one who fears the LORD always, but whoever hardens his heart will fall into calamity." (Prov 28:14)
- "Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised." (Prov 31:30)

#### (Merriam-Webster Dictionary)


- 1. "an unpleasant, often strong emotion caused by anticipation or awareness of danger; anxious concern; or unpleasant alarm"

## Proverbs 2:1-15

- 1 My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you,
- 2 turning your ear to wisdom and applying your heart to understanding—
- 3 indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding,
- 4 and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure,
- 5 then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.

## Proverbs 2:1-15

- 6 For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.
- 7 He holds success in store for the upright, he is a shield to those whose walk is blameless,
- 8 for he guards the course of the just and protects the way of his faithful ones.
- 9 Then you will understand what is right and just and fair—every good path.
- 10 For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.

## Proverbs 2:1-15

- 11 Discretion will protect you, and understanding will guard you.
- 12 Wisdom will save you from the ways of wicked men, from men whose words are perverse,
- 13 who have left the straight paths to walk in dark ways,
- 14 who delight in doing wrong and rejoice in the perverseness of evil,
- 15 whose paths are crooked and who are devious in their ways.
