

  - 27% expect to receive presents they will never use or wear. (Approx \$1 billion dollars in unused gifts)



- The wise men gave SIGNIFICANT gifts that help us to understand who Jesus is and why we should get excited about Christmas!

- These Magi present the baby Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense & myrrh. (v.11)
- Gold = a gift for a king. (Signifies that Jesus IS the King of everything.)
- We see this confirmed in the life and ministry of Jesus.
  - He heals the sick.
  - He casts out demons.
  - He commands nature with a word.
  - He raises the dead.
  - He claims that He will be crucified, buried and then three days later will rise again.

(He is & does - these events verified by eyewitnesses).

- Myrrh was an embalming spice used in preparation for burial.
- (Signifies HOW Jesus would restore us to right relationship with God – by laying down His life so we might live)

#### Mark 10:45

For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

#### **Matthew 2:13-15**

When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." <sup>14</sup> So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, <sup>15</sup> where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son."
