

We Believe...

The two ordinances of the Lord Jesus Christ, namely Baptism and the Lord's Supper; Baptism being the immersion of believers upon profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and a symbol of the fellowship of the regenerate in His death, burial and resurrection; the Lord's Supper being a memorial, until He comes, of the sacrifice of the body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ.

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Ordinance = ordained or commanded by Jesus

<u>Matthew 28:18-20</u>

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

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The two ordinances of the Lord Jesus Christ, namely Baptism and the Lord's Supper;

Jesus commands us to baptise new disciples of Jesus.
Baptism marks the BEGINNING of the Christian Faith.

Luke 22:14-20

¹⁴ And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. ¹⁵ And he said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶ For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." ¹⁷ And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, "Take this, and divide it among yourselves. ¹⁸ For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." ¹⁹ And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁰ And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.

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Jesus commands us to remember him through the practice of breaking bread and drinking wine.
The Lord's Supper marks the CONTINUATION of the faith in the life of Jesus disciples.

Ordinance #1 - Baptism

Baptism being the immersion of believers upon profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and a symbol of the fellowship of the regenerate in His death, burial and resurrection



Commanded & modelled by Jesus. Commanded in Matthew 28:19 Modelled in Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-23

<u>Matthew 3:13-17</u>

¹³ Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. ¹⁴ But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" ¹⁵ Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented. ¹⁶ As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷ And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."



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The early church preached on the need for baptism.

Acts 2:38-39

³⁸ And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."



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Follows belief & repentance.
It is for all those who profess their faith in Jesus.

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⁴¹ So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

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<u>Acts 8:12-13</u>

¹² But when they believed Philip as he preached good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women. ¹³ Even Simon himself believed, and after being baptized he continued with Philip. And seeing signs and great miracles performed, he was amazed.



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A picture (or symbol) of the gospel.
Baptise = to dip under, to submerge, to immerse

Hence ...the <u>immersion</u> of believers upon profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ...

<u>Romans 6:3-4</u>

³ Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.



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1. Baptism

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A picture (or symbol) of the gospel. The outward sign of an inward change! (Romans 6:3-4; 2 Cor 5:17; Gal 2:20; 1 Peter 3:21 etc.)

Note: it is not the water that cleanses us from sin (Mt 15:11; Eph 2:8-9)

<u>Colossians 2:11-14</u>

¹¹ In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, ¹² having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead. ¹³ And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

3. DOCTRINAL STATEMENT3.1 The Doctrines of the Church shall be:

3.1.1 The Divine Inspiration and Supreme Authority of the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

3.1.2 The existence of One God in three Persons - the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

3.1.3 The Deity and Incarnation of the Lord Jesus Christ, who is the Son of God, the Second Person in the Holy Trinity.

3.1.4 The fallen, sinful and lost estate of all mankind.

3.1.5 The salvation of people from the consequences and the power of sin through the perfect obedience of the Lord Jesus Christ, His atoning death, His resurrection from the dead, His ascension to the right hand of the Father and His unchanging Priesthood.

3.1.6 The immediate work of the Holy Spirit in the regeneration of people, in their sanctification and in their preservation to the heavenly kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ.

3.1.7 The necessity, in order to obtain salvation, of repentance towards God, and of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

3.1.8 The resurrection of the dead, and the final judgement of all people by the Lord Jesus Christ.
