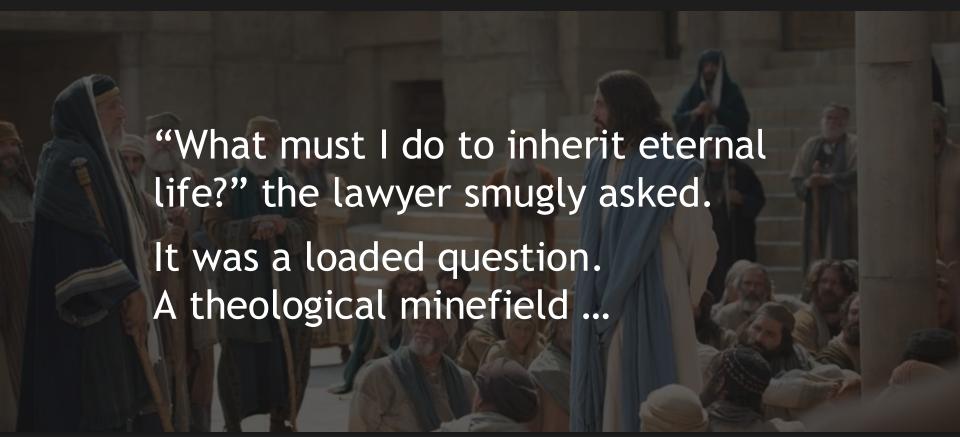






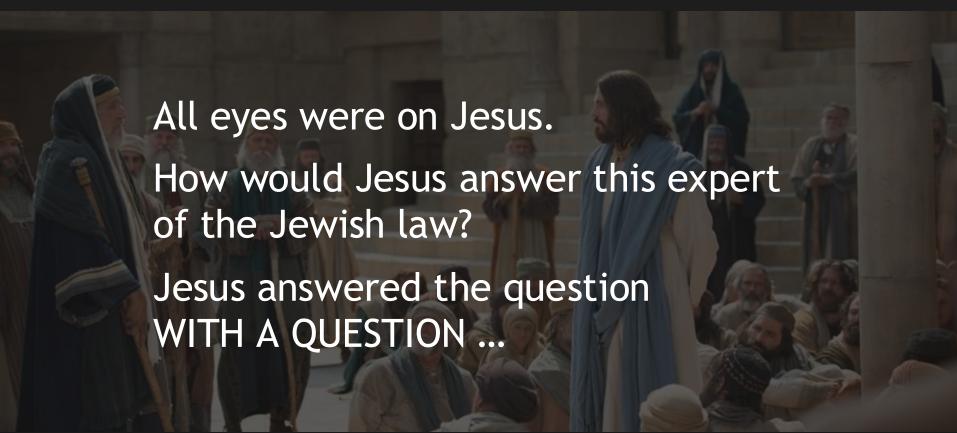






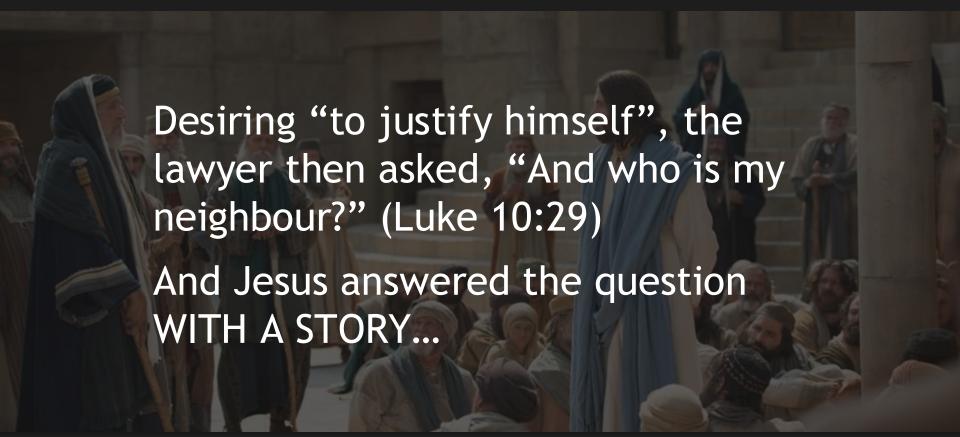


















BUT there is also the other side of the coin! Discipleship takes effort.
