

Our words can be used for good or bad.




Wise words build up.

Do we think about our words?

- ☐ We speak (on average) around 13,000 words per day. 1
 - a 2007 study reported as much as 16,000 words per day. 2
- □ We listen (on average) to around 20,000 30,000 words per day.²
- ☐ Our words often come out quickly and without too much thought
- ☐ The book of Proverbs refers to the tongue (& mouth, lips, speech, words etc.) over 1000 times across 128 verses.


"But if you can control your tongue, you are mature and able to control your whole body."

Cf. Luke 6:45 (NIV)

A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart.

For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of. (see also Mt. 12:34; 15:18)

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2. Wise words build others up.

- ☐ The words of the righteous give life and support because they are connected to the very source of life to God.
- ☐ Wise words point others back to the ultimate source of life and nourishment the God who made us!

Proverbs 10:21 (NIV)

The lips of the righteous nourish many, but fools die for lack of sense.

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- ☐ Wise words point people back to God's word.

- ☐ Those who aren't righteous, who do not fear God seek to tear others down quickly.
- ☐ Instead of providing wise words of life, foolish mouths conceal (hide) violence and hatred.
- ☐ Foolish words are untrue, slanderous, unrestrained, rash & often manipulative.
- ☐ Foolish words are spoken to steal the joy of others by inflicting them with ourselves.
